

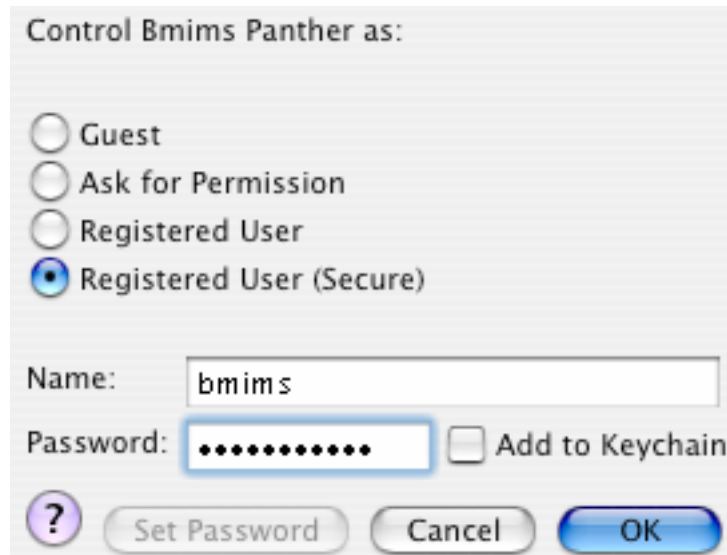
How to establish a secure Timbuktu Pro connection between 2 Mac's

Note: This documentation assumes that you are running Timbuktu Pro v8.0 on each operating system. In order to establish a secure SSH connections between 2 Mac's, users must authenticate with there OS X system accounts. Also, Timbuktu Pro Exchange permissions (with this type of connection) will be defined by the permission of the OS X user account that you authenticate with. Timbuktu Pro uses the SSH integration built into the Mac10.3 operating system to secure a connection.

1. Create a Mac OS X user account for Timbuktu Pro on the host machine by going under the Setup/Defined users menu.
2. Select Mac OSX user from the "Type" drop down menu. Make sure that the username specified is identical (Case sensitive) to the OS X User account present on the machine.



3. From the Guest machine launch your Timbuktu Pro application and open the New Connection window. From the New Connection window select the tab that contains the picture of the globe and input the host machines IP address.
4. Select a service to initiate your connection, and then select the Register User (secure) option from your Timbuktu Pro login window.



5. Once a connection has been established a “Secure” message will appear at the top of the Control screen window.
